Jesus' Second Coming, from What We Teach - Doctrinal Statement of McLean Bible Church

We teach the personal, bodily return of the Lord Jesus Christ before the seven-year tribulation (Acts 1:11; I Thessalonians 4:16; Titus 2:13) to remove His church from this earth (John 14:1-3; I Corinthians 15:51-53, I Thessalonians 4:16-17), and to reward believers according to their works (I Corinthians 3:11-15; II Corinthians 5:10), with sufficient time elapsing between this event and His glorious return with His church to allow for the judgment of believers works.

Select verses regarding Jesus' Second Coming:

1. Time Unknown

- For as the lightning comes from the east and flashed to the west, so will be the coming of the Son of Man. (Matthew 24:27)
- You also must be ready, because the Son of Man will come at an hour when you do not expect him. (Luke 12:40)
- He who testifies to these things says, "Yes, I am coming soon." Amen. Come, Lord Jesus (Revelation 22:20)

2. Coming unmistakably

- "But I say to all of you: In the future, you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of the Mighty One coming on the clouds of Heaven." (Matthew 26:64)
- At that time they will see the Son of Man coming in a cloud with power and great glory. (Luke 21:27)

3. Will judge the world

- All the nations will be gathered before Him, and he will separate the people from one another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. (Matthew 25:32)
- For the Son of Man is going to come in His Father's glory with his angels, and then he will reward each person according to what he has done. (Matthew 16:27)
